Public Art Waymaker Project Update – Mid Sussex District Council invited applications from artists to design, produce and install a series of eight permanent waymarkers at designated sites. The waymarkers will identify start and finish points and some points of interest along the route. Each submission received will need to be individually scored prior to a moderation meeting to review the scores and select an artist. The Clerk to attend the first evaluation panel meeting on the 6th June.

Each waymarker should provide 8 x 8cm space to add project signage and a QR code at a later date. (The QR codes will link to a website with details of community arts projects in some areas. The participatory activities are separate to this commission.) The design of each waymarker should be unique and the local themes are shown below:

Waymarker 1: Lindfield High Street (OS Grid Ref TQ348258) Pollinators – bees, butterflies and insects

Waymarker 2: Ansty Recreation Ground (OS Grid Ref TQ290233) Sports - cricket and football

Waymarker 3: Handcross Recreation Ground (OS Grid Ref TQ263300) - Local flora - trees and plants

Waymarker 4: Balcombe Station (OS Grid Ref TQ306301) -Celestial bodies - sun, moon and stars

Waymarker 5: Worth Way East (OS Grid Ref TQ314366) - Local fauna - wildlife

Waymarker 6: Crawley Down Pond (OS Grid Ref TQ353377) - Pondlife

Waymarker 7: East Grinstead Railway Station Car Park (OS Grid Ref TQ387382) - Bluebell Railway

Waymarker 8: Finche Field Car Park, West Hoathly (OS Grid Ref TQ366325) – Toposcope;

The District Council will apply for Planning approval and get the necessary Licenses from the landowners to install the waymarkers. MSDC intend to appoint an artist by the beginning of July and aim to get the waymarkers installed by September 2023.

- 11. Highways/Footpaths: to review highways projects/items
 - 11.1. High Beeches Lane B2110 Members to consider (TRO) to investigate speed reduction/traffic calming requirements from the High Street junction to High Beeches Gardens. The Clerk advised that having spoken with the Highways Officer the lane is derestricted (national speed limit) commonly mis-interpreted as 60mph limit. De-restricted actually means the highway authority has not set a safe speed and drivers are advised to drive accordingly. If the Parish are asking for a 40 or 50 speed limit to be applied, we are advising that these speed limits may not be safe or appropriate and engineering measures may be required to ensure compliance. To ensure that we would need a Community TRO application so a traffic officer can investigate.

We were advised that as engineering measures are likely to be more than £3,000 the TRO may turn into a Community Highway scheme which has a cap of £300,000. The Clerk, Richard Speller WSCC Highways Officer have a meeting scheduled for the 10th May 2022 with the local resident to look at what measures that are in place that can be improved upon and what can be additional measure could be investigated and what costs are attached to those.
