St Martin Close (East)

St Martin Close (East) owned by the Parish Council is allocated for residential-led development for up to 30 dwellings within the made Slaugham Neighbourhood Plan (SNP).

Whilst it was envisaged the site would be delivered early in the Plan period (2022) the Council have been judiciously working on a range of options for facilitating development and, or disposal of the site.

In that period St.Martin Close (West) the subject of a subsequent reserve allocation within the now adopted <u>Small Allocation Development Plan</u>, has come forward and both sites are considered suitable and required for development to meet Mid Sussex's residual housing need requirements over the Plan period up to 2031.

We have been working in close partnership with our professional advisers who have assisted in the preparation of a report that provides guidance to the Council in their determination of how best to proceed.

We are pleased to advise that we are moving into the engagement phases of this project. A meeting has been scheduled for Monday 20th February 7.30pm – 8.30pm in the Sports Pavilion, High Street, Handcross.
