Please help us to keep **YOUR** Parish tidy.




Neighbourhood Plan update

The Scoping Report for the Neighbourhood Plan has been through its consultation phase, and received positive responses from the Statutory Consultees who responded. We are now incorporating their suggestions into the Sustainability Appraisal and the draft Neighbourhood Plan.

Meanwhile, we have to address the controversial "alternative proposal" which the Hyde Estate outlined last year, that of moving recreation facilities from the current Recreation Ground to a larger site behind the Horsham Road. The proposal will only go forward if there is sufficient public support for the change and we will therefore be providing information, an opportunity for a public discussion, and a chance for you to have your say on this over the next couple of months.
