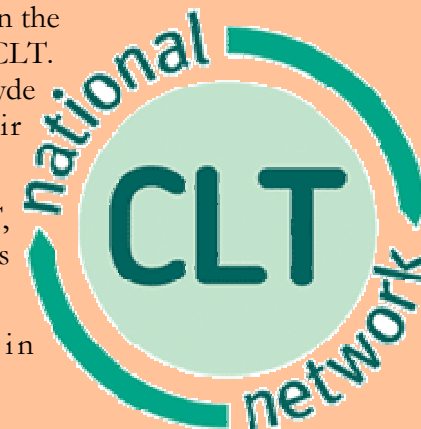

## A Community Land Trust is launching in this Parish

Slaugham Parish Community Land Trust (CLT) is a community benefit society with the object of providing and managing social housing and other community based resources, including recreation facilities, for local people. Membership of the CLT is open to anyone over 18 who lives in the Parish by purchase of a single £1 share. Members will have a vote on decisions on the management of any the assets acquired by the CLT. The founding board is in discussions with Hyde Hallam about involvement in their developments in Handcross.

## Neighbourhood Plan

Work continues on the Neighbourhood Plan, as it does in parishes across Mid Sussex. Cuckfield's residents have voted for their NHP, which now forms part of the planning law affecting their parish, and Hurstpierpont and Sayers Common's NHP goes to referendum in February. Once the Committee have completed the early, necessary statutory work on the Scoping Report and Sustainability Appraisal, we will be consulting everyone on the policies, plans, and aims – the vision for the parish in the future – that should be in our revised NHP.

## Broadband update

In the Autumn newsletter we mentioned the good news for Handcross and Pease Pottage residents, the majority of whom are now able to access superfast broadband from the updated cabinets. West Sussex County Council has confirmed that there is still work planned for those properties directly connected to the Warninglid exchange, which is to be welcomed.

However, there will still be properties in the Parish (in particular in Slaugham) where fibre-based superfast broadband is not available. Additional funding (from both government and the County Council) is available for extending superfast coverage to properties such as these, and WSCC are currently carrying out a procurement process to contract a supplier for this work. We have asked that properties in the Parish not yet covered are considered for this funding.

## Handcross Family Funday 2015—Saturday 4th July

Preparations are now underway for this year's family funday!

Last year we made a few changes to the fun day and hope that you liked them. Look forward to a few more different things this year too. The fun day will run from 12 midday to 4pm, with all the usual fun of the fair and attractions including the dog show, licensed bar, arena attractions, BBQ, grand raffle, and much more. Entry as always is free. We are, as always, grateful to Slaugham Parish Council who allow us to hold the fun day on the recreation ground each year.

The fun day is organised by a small group of 7 volunteers who work very hard to get everything in place helped by a few others on the day.

We are always looking for more helpers either on the day, before the day to help set up and on the Sunday to help put things away after the fun day is over.
