Neighbourhood Plan update

In January the Examiner for the Slaugham Neighbourhood Plan issued her report to Mid Sussex District Council. The Examiner's opinion was that the Strategic Environmental Assessment carried out did not meet the requirements of the relevant EU regulation, and as such she was unable to recommend that the Neighbourhood Plan could proceed to referendum in its present form. In a letter sent to MSDC and the Parish Council the Examiner stated that the "aspirations and ambitions of the Parish Council were sound. It seemed to me that it is largely the process followed that has resulted in this outcome."

Since then we have had a meeting with MSDC and are working with them to find the best way to move forward with the NHP. We are also waiting with interest to see the outcome of the Examination of the Cuckfield NHP, and the result of the judicial review of a NHP in Cheshire which will give further guidance on the relationship of NHPs and the Local Plan. While the Examiner's recommendation was initially a disappointment, it does mean that there is now an opportunity to take account of the changes within the Parish and ensure that a revised NHP meets the needs of the Parish over the next 20 years.

There will be a meeting on **Tuesday 3rd June, at 7.30pm** in The Pavilion, Handcross to determine the structure and composition of the Neighbourhood Plan Committee and to discuss next steps – everyone welcome.

We would like to thank everyone in our four villages who has been involved in the pro cess over the last two years, and hope that they and many others will continue to help the Parish Council find the right Neighbourhood Plan which will meet the needs of our villages in the future.

At long last...

New Community Facility at Pease Pottage

Please don't switch off with cries of 'heard it all before.' Finally, some really good news! According to a recent MSDC press release:

"The project still requires planning permission but, subject to approval, and with good weather and ground conditions, the new sports pavilion and community building at Finches Field could be completed within the next 9 to 12 months."

At a meeting on 24th March of MSDC cabinet members, the release of the funds to build our new hall was approved. The Cabinet approved the release of over £500,000 in Section S106 funds to not only pay for the construction of the new pavilion but also to acquire the additional land at Finches Field not currently in the ownership of the council.

MSDC have taken on board all the information and views gathered from the numerous consultations and surveys that have been carried out over the past few years, and will use this to finalise the design of the new building. Work is also under way to secure a company to carry out the construction work.

MSDC is working alongside SPC to ensure this project goes ahead at last so all the newly formed groups in Pease Pottage can have a permanent home. We will keep you updated with news as we get it.
